

## Student Radio Live-Stream

Playing "your fresh new variety of hits from yesterday and today," Suffolk County Community College's first-ever radio station began streaming live on Wednesday November 15 at 11:15 a.m. when College President Dr. Shaun L. McKay threw the switch to make the station live.

The new station was constructed over the summer adjacent to the college's radio and television production studios. Programming will be pre-recorded by students and streamed 24 hours per day at [scccir.com](http://scccir.com).

"This is a unique opportunity that provides our radio and television production students the opportunity to work with state-of-the-art technology that is incorporated into our curriculum," McKay said. "Our faculty, staff and especially our students worked very hard over the summer and through the first half of the semester turning what started out as a storage room and a dream into a fully functional, live internet radio station," McKay added.
