New SUNY Policy for Students with Prior Felony Convictions Criminal History Form – Study Abroad Programs

As outlined in the Notice regarding New SUNY Policy for Students with Prior Felony Convictions, State University of New York (SUNY) policy prohibits the College's admission applications from inquiring into an applicant's prior criminal history. However, after acceptance, the College is required to inquire if a student previously has been convicted of a felony if the student seeks participation in clinical or field experiences, internships or study abroad programs. The information required to be disclosed under SUNY policy regarding felony convictions will be reviewed by a standing College committee consistent with the legal standards articulated in the New York State Correction Law.

You must <u>complete and return this form to the College's Office of Enrollment Management</u> before you will be permitted to participate in a Study Abroad Program through the College. Please note that a <u>failure to timely submit this form and, if required, follow-up documentation may delay or preclude participation in the covered program or activity.</u>

Notice Regarding New SUNY Policy for Students with Prior Felony Convictions Summer 2020

State University of New York (SUNY) policy prohibits the College's admission applications from inquiring into an applicant's prior criminal history.

However, after acceptance, the College is required to inquire if a student previously has been convicted of a felony if the student seeks participation in clinical or field experiences, internships, or study abroad programs.

First, please allow us to emphasize that a student who discloses a prior felony conviction is not automatically barred from participating in a Study Abroad program.

All applicants for Study Abroad programs MUST complete the enclosed above Criminal History Form and return this form by mail or email to the College's Office of Enrollment Management as outlined on the form, or hand it in in a sealed envelope during Program Orientation.

Do not return the Criminal History Form to the Study Abroad Office.

The information required to be disclosed by students under SUNY policy regarding such felony convictions will be reviewed by a standing College committee consistent with the legal standards articulated in the New York State Correction Law. This review must take place before a student can participate in Study Abroad.

Please note that a failure to timely submit this form and, if required, follow-up documentation may delay or preclude participation in Study Abroad. We encourage you to return the completed form as soon as practicable but no later than April 3,2020.
