Baked Dozens of Cookies for Southampton Hospital

Justin Ranghell, 24, a Center Moriches culinary student at Suffolk County Community College, witnessed the stresses pandemic medical workers are enduring: his sister, Melissa, a 2017 Suffolk County Community College Nursing School graduate, is on the Coronavirus pandemic's frontline at Stony Brook Southampton Hospital.

"This was a great opportunity to give back to the frontline workers that are fighting for us each and every day," Ranghell said. "I hope to do it again to express my thanks and appreciation."

selfless effort, and join him with our thanks to medical workers, first responders and all those on the frontline battle of the fight against the coronavirus and its spread," said Suffolk County Community College Interim President Louis Petrizzo.

a student – he will graduate from

Greenport where he works when not in
